RARE CANCER FACTS

Approximately **1 in 5** people living with cancer in the United States are diagnosed with a rare cancer.

All pediatric cancers are rare.¹



The 5-year survival rate is **lower for patients with a rare cancer** than for those diagnosed with a more common cancer.¹

Efforts to **increase awareness of rare cancer** symptoms in patients and clinicians could lead to earlier detection and improvements in survival.²
